In 1962, three separate courses of agriculture, textile-dyeing, and clothing of Tokamachi high school were independent as Tokamachi vocational high school. Since then, we have been contributing to the promotion of industry in this Tokamachi area. In 1993, the courses were integrated as comprehensive course, and renamed Tokamachi Sogo high school. Our school was reopened as the first comprehensive high school in Niigata. 2012 marked the 50th anniversary.
